## **FINANCIAL REPORT** – *Kim Kramarz, Controller*

- The 2021 financial year included expenses at \$49.6 million and revenue at \$49.5 million with fund balance use close to \$110,000. Unassigned reserve balance is at 26% with a goal of 20%. Committed fund balance is set at \$1 million.
- Current 2022 expenses are at 21% and revenues are 18.5%. The first half of the Foundational Public Health Services funding (\$1.3 million) has been received. The Spokane County first quarter allocation was received in January. Unassigned reserves are at 21%. The \$500,000 in emergency fund balance funds used during the COVID-19 response has been replenished bringing the total to \$1.5 million.
- The 2023 budget process will begin with form development in June.

## **ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER'S REPORT** – Amelia Clark, Administrative Officer

- The Spokane community was thanked for their support during National Public Health Week.
- SRHD strategic plan development that was delayed due to the pandemic response will begin again.
- Disease Prevention & Response staff are being trained in project management.

# HEALTH OFFICER REPORT - Francisco Velázquez, MD, SM, FCAP, Health Officer

- Omicron BA2.12.1 variant cases are increasing and are about 5% of cases in Washington State. King County has the highest number of cases in the state. There have 772 cases of Omicron in Spokane County.
- There have been 45 hospitalizations and 4 deaths due to influenza in Spokane County. Influenza A is the prominent strain.

• There have been approximately 200 pediatric Hepatitis cases of unknown origins throughout the world and United States (14 cases).

# **AGENCY REPORTS**

AJ Sanders, Health Program Specialist from the Youth Cannabis & Commercial Tobacco Program, provided a report on youth cannabis and commercial tobacco prevention legislation and its impacts to Spokane County.
