

## **Bike/Pedestrian Collisions**

Injury & Violence





Indicator: Bike/Pedestrian Collisions

**Definition**: Rate of motor vehicle collisions involving a pedestrian or bicycle per 100,000 individuals.

Why this is important: People walk and ride a bicycle for recreation, exercise, and commuting. Reasons for these activities may include gas prices, environmental concerns, and improving health. If a community does not account for the needs of bicyclists and pedestrians, they are at risk for injury. Motorists, bicyclists, and pedestrians must all act responsibly to ensure safety for all. A community with a road system that accommodates multiple modes of travel also decreases the risk of injury.


Where we are: In 2014 in Spokane County, there were 270 motor vehicle collisions involving a pedestrian or bicycle. The bike/pedestrian collision rate was stable from 2010 to 2014. The 2014 bike/pedestrian collision rate in Spokane County was significantly higher than that of Washington state.

## **Health Disparities:**

Among Spokane County residents in 2014:


- The likelihood of being involved in a bike or pedestrian collision decreased as the age of the cyclist or pedestrian increased.
- Male bicyclists or pedestrians were more likely to be involved in a collision with a motor vehicle than females.
